Lent begins this week on Wednesday with the Mass of Ash Wednesday. Masses are at 10.00am and 7.00pm. It is a day of Fasting And Abstinence.

LENT ACTIVITIES: Stations of the Cross: 7.00pm on Fridays. Normally followed by Mass

Holy Hour with Benediction: Thursdays 7.00pm – 8.00pm with a meditation on next Sunday's readings. This is an opportunity for the most powerful prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, Our Bishop and the Holy Father have called us to adoration. Many graces are received before the Blessed Sacrament.

Also **walk with me Booklets** are available £2. They have a meditation for each day of Lent. A chance to come closer to Christ through the Word of God.

WHEN YOU CONSIDER WHAT TO GIVE UP THIS LENT,, also plan for what you'll replace it with... Because every time we say "no" to something, we're saying "yes" to something else — even if we don't realize it. **Here are things you can say "yes" to while you say "no" to what you're giving up:**

If you're giving up social media: Replace it with reading the daily Mass readings, or a daily devotional, or replace it with listening to a podcast ([like ours](#) or the [Bible in a Year](#) podcast). Text a friend about what you're reading. Put a picture of a short prayer as the background of your phone and pray it every time you reach for it. **If you're giving up podcasts, tv shows, or movies:** Replace it with watching or listening to Catholic talks that help you grow in your faith life, like our online Pray More Novenas' [Lenten Retreat](#), or [Formed videos](#), or daily homilies you can find online. Take the time you would have spent watching a show and pray the [Rosary](#) or the [Divine Mercy Chaplet](#), or visit the Lord in Eucharistic Adoration.

Join Young Adults from across the diocese of Nottingham to enter more deeply into prayer this Lent with **SYCAMORE'S 'LEARNING TO PRAY THIS LENT'**. Just bring yourself, a bible, and a hot drink of your choice (unless you're fasting!). With lots of practical tips, wisdom from the bible, stories from the saints, and advice about common difficulties people face when praying. DIOCESAN PASTORAL PLAN 2026 to 2030 called "Go make disciples. This plan will form the framework and inspiration for our parish going forward and is built upon the bishops 3 aims of encountering Christ ever more deeply glad growing in discipleship that is to say in our following of Christ and mission that is in sharing our faith in our daily lives in various ways. The heart of the Pastoral Plan is about the spiritual renewal of our parishes, chaplaincies and schools, so that we might encourage and make best use of the gifts and talents of more and more people in our attempts over the next five years to become ever more outward-looking and missionary as a diocese. I hope to form a group of parishioners – a mission team-interested in engaging and seeing how this plan can form our way forward and inspire and renew our Parish. The 4 diocesan priorities are:

1. Taking practical steps to bring to life the vision for Encounter (growth in prayer; discipleship (supporting ongoing conversion); and mission (nurturing witness of life) supported by the Eucharist and greater openness to the Holy Spirit.
2. Equipping the laity to work alongside the clergy in renewing parishes for mission
3. Equipping and supporting our clergy
4. Aligning diocesan and parish infrastructure and resources to the Pastoral Plan for mission.
